

## 5.5. INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

The main purpose of international cooperation is assisting the policy of the government of St. Petersburg in various joint activities with the foreign partners: town-partners and region-partners of St. Petersburg; international intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations, uniting cities and countries of the world (international organizations); public organizations, conducting international activity.

For fulfilling this purpose the work is conducted for the planning, development and realization of the international programs and projects in the framework of cooperation of St. Petersburg with foreign partners in various spheres. The Committee for Foreign Affairs coordinates international activity of the structural departments of executive authorities of St. Petersburg on the issues of cooperation with foreign partners and also assists municipalities, organizations and enterprises of the city to establish and to develop the cooperation with the partners from foreign cities and regions. The Committee also assists public organizations, which are involved in the international cooperation.

Numerous international organizations are represented in St. Petersburg. There are offices representing foreign cities, the chambers of industry and commerce, international funds and alliances and UN affiliated organizations in St. Petersburg.

There are diplomatic representatives of more than 50 foreign states in St. Petersburg.

In 2006 the summit of the heads of states of "Big Eight" countries was held in St. Petersburg for the first time on Russian territory.

St. Petersburg is planning to open European center for regional cooperation.

Since 1998 St. Petersburg is a member of the international organizations of Baltic Sea Region, the organization "Euro-cities" and "International association of congresses and conferences".

### 5.5.1. Participation of St. Petersburg in the Baltic Sea Region Neighborhood Program in 2004-2006

The purpose of the Program is increasing the degree of the spatial integration and competitiveness in the Baltic Sea region by means of intensification of the regional, economic and social interaction and development. In the framework of the Program the projects, which are realized in following spheres are supported:

- The development of the joint strategies and realization of various activities for macro-regions;
- Assisting sustainable spatial development of the specifics sectors;
- Sustainable and integrated development of coastal zones, island and other specific territories;
- Assisting balanced development of the polycentric structures of settlements;
- Creating stable system of communications for improving spatial integration;
- Improving the management of cultural and natural legacy, unique landscapes and natural resources;
- Trans-national activities for creating the institutions and developing the potential of organizations

Following countries and regions are participating in the Program:

- Denmark, Sweden, Finland
- Germany (North-West)
- Estonia, Lithuania, Latvia
- Poland, Norway
- Belarus: Minsk, Grodno, Brest, Vitebsk provinces (oblasts)
- Russia: St. Petersburg, Murmansk, Leningrad, Pskov, Novgorod, Kaliningrad, and Arkhangelsk regions (oblasts) and Nenetsky autonomous region.
